Downtown Dollars Tracking

Sarah reported that \$730 in DDB\$ were redeemed in June and \$3,150 so far in July. She completed 9 DDB\$ pickups.

To date in 2025, \$4,975 DDB\$ have been issued — \$650 donated and \$4,325 sold. Of this, \$1,090 has been redeemed, with \$3,885 outstanding.

Since 2018, \$293,240 DDB\$ have been issued, with \$252,520 redeemed and \$40,720 still outstanding.
